

A: A data breach occurs when unauthorized individuals gain access to confidential information. This can happen when they infiltrate computer systems, networks, or databases. The breached data may include personal information, financial records, intellectual property, or

any other protected information that falls into the wrong hands. The consequences of a data breach can be severe, including financial losses, reputational damage, legal implications, and potential harm to victims1.

It is not always easy to find out if you have been the victim of a data breach, but here is a quick way you can check: Visit https://haveibeenpwned.com/

Of particular interest is the Home tab, the "Who's been pwned" tab, and the passwords tab.

You can learn what sites have been breached, when it happened, and the information that was leaked.

Protect yourself by employing 2-factor authentication on your accounts and changing your passwords.
